She graduated from Columbus East High School in 1970. She inherited the nickname Cynn timer from her sister Debbie because she could not say Cynthia when they were little girls. She worked in retail sales after high school, but always had the desire to be a entrepreneur. She left Columbus, OH and moved to Oakland, CA and fulfilled her working dreams. She became a self-taught runway model and modeled all over the world. She loved working with clothes and accessorized everything! She was well-known in Oakland as Ms. Black.

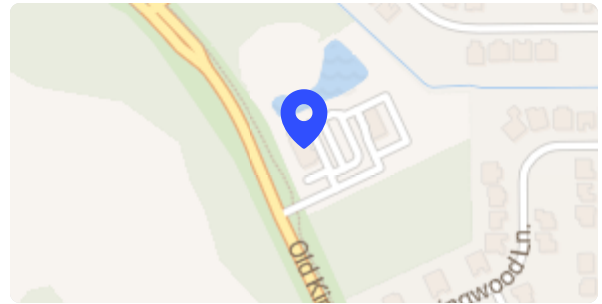
